Come one come all to Tim & Marty's 2016 Aviation Tour July 16

I had originally thought to end the tour at the Air Force Museum. But several things have prevented me from doing so. The Waco Museum doesn't open till Noon on Saturdays and that would have us arriving at the Museum around 400pm and the Museum closes at 500pm.

The Air Force Museum should be a tour onto itself. You can easily spend all day there, I know I could. Plus this tour is more about driving on less traveled roads that just happen to have a few interesting destinations on it. Rather than it being about the destination itself. I really hated not being able to include the Museum since I REALLY wanted to see the new exhibits and building.

We will start off by meeting at Ghostlight Coffee at 1201 Wayne Ave. Dayton at 1000am. Leave around 1030 and head to the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park at 22 S. Williams. Leave there around 1115 and head to the Waco Museum at 1865 S. Co Rd 25A Troy, OH. There is a \$6 admission fee, \$5 with military ID. Depending on how many cars there are it will probably be difficult to exit downtown as a group. I have a re-group location at The Boonshoft Museum of Discovery at 2600 Deseese Pkwy. To get there we will be leaving The Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park going north on Williams St. Turning right onto W. 3rd st and then left onto N. Patterson Blvd. which is the third st past Main St. Continue on Patterson Blvd and when it crosses Monument St. it turns into Riverside Dr. Stay on Riverside Dr until

you come to the second cross street which is Ridge Ave. Turn right onto Ridge Ave and the first left is Deseese Pkwy. You will see the Museum on the right. We will then proceed to the Waco Museum.

We will leave the museum around 1230 and head to The Champaign Aviation Museum at 1625 N. Main St Urbana, OH. Next door to the Museum is the Urbana Airport Café. They are known for their home backed pies. Marty and I tried their cherry while doing a pre-tour and it was quite tasty. Depending on everyone's appetite we can either tour the museum first or try some pie.

When all the pie is devoured we will head south going once around the Urbana traffic circle, traffic permitting, and stop at Brandeberry Winery at 5118 W. Jackson Rd. Enon, OH. After the winery a final stop at Stillwrights Distillery at 5380 Intrastate Dr. Fairborn, OH.

None of the times are set in stone just a general idea of what to expect. Just keep your seats in the upright and locked position and enjoy the ride.
