John Coutant

This is kind of bittersweet, my last president's column for the Marque as this month I will pass the reins to Jeff Barth at the March Banquet. I thought it was important to take a look back at the past four years of my 2 terms and thank everyone

who supported me. They were four strange years.

Probably the biggest impact was COVID which arrived in the winter of 2019-20. For a social club that thrives on face to face meetings and events this was a real challenge. We moved to virtual meetings through video conferencing and everyone really worked to learn and use a technology that not many were familiar with. It was not until mid-2021 that we resumed in person meetings at Archer's. Our annual March Banquet was also a victim of COVID in 2020 and 2021. We did start having events outside in the summer of 2020 where we could maintain social distancing but Dayton BCD was canceled. As vaccine became available in 2021 and more and more people were vaccinated, we started meeting in person in June of that year. In spite of the challenges over the year and a half imposed by COVID regulations, club members responded with ideas, events, and support to keep MVT going. Thank you to each and every one of you.

The other big impact on the club was hosting the TRA National Meet. Planning and organizing this event takes a lot of work and effort. The organizing committee lead by Bruce Clough did this not once but three times. Unfortunately, all the hard work leading to the events planned in Lexington in 2020 and the one postponed to 2021 did not result in an event as they were cancelled due to COVID. The MVT event committee decided to step back and regroup letting Mason-Dixon plan TRA 2022.

The TRA organizing committee decided to change venues and started planning for TRA 2023 at Hueston Woods during 2022. Once again, the support and willingness to work by MVT members was great. All this work resulted in a well-received TRA 2023 by everyone who attended. I cannot thank everyone enough who contributed to this success, from those on the organizing committee to individual members who helped out during the event.

Other than 2020, we have put on Dayton BCD along with the MG club for the last 3 years. It takes planning and work to support those areas we are responsible for like registration and ballot

counting along with a few other areas. Again, thanks to everyone who has stepped up to work a few hours whether helping registration in the morning, helping park spectators, or counting ballots. And special thanks to those on the organizing committees responsible for those areas.

Why all these thanks? Well it is important to acknowledge the efforts of everyone in the club. Being president is a bit like herding cats – all you can do is make sure everyone is headed in the right direction and make sure you get the stragglers up with the group. It is the group of people that get things done.

I hope I have left MVT in as good if not better position than when I came into office. That is a result of all your contributions. Thank you!
